Myself and members of the Senior Leadership Team have spent time this week carrying out drop ins to lessons and finding students who are demonstrating our SHINE values to award them with a Headteacher's postcard. It has been a joy and privilege and we are already running out of cards because so many students are doing so well!

To continue our celebration of our students' skills and talents, our Creative Arts evening takes place on Wednesday 27th March at 7pm, the cost of tickets is £4 for adults and £2 for concessions and all tickets can be purchased via the school shop. This will be an evening where we will be showcasing all forms of creative art and having seen some of the rehearsal performances I can confidently say it will be an amazing evening.
