

Our Year 11 pupils are preparing for their examinations, which begin in May. Please keep them in your prayers as they begin their final journey at All Saints'.







<u>History Department Krakow Trip - 9-12 Feb 2024</u>

On Friday, February 9th 2024, 49 pupils, 6 staff and 2 tour guides embarked on a profound journey to Krakow, Poland. The adventure began at a very early 3:45 am, and after a captivating journey through coach and aeroplane, we arrived in Krakow ready to delve into its rich history.

Our first stop was the Jewish quarter, Kazimierz, where we immersed ourselves in the profound impact of German occupation on the Jewish community. Szeroka Street, the heart of the Jewish town, echoed with tales of resilience and history. The visit to the Remuh Synagogue and cemetery added a sombre but essential layer to our exploration, highlighting the enduring spirit of a community marked by historical challenges.

After a delicious lunch of lovely baguettes, ate by a nearby market, we continued our journey to the UNESCO Salt Mines, one of the oldest salt mines in the world. Descending into the depths of this remarkable site, our pupils were awed by the intricate salt carvings and the centuries-old history preserved within the mine's walls.



To start this half term girls PE have done 3 weeks of fitness. Pupils have carried out a variety of fitness tests and looked at the difference between fitness testing, fitness training and understanding components of fitness. The tests that pupils conducted were the Multi-Stage Fitness Test (bleep test), 12-Minute Cooper Run, Illinois Agility Test, Standing Stork Test, Ruler Drop Test, Sit and Reach Test, Tennis Ball Throw and Catch Test, One-Minute Press-ups and One-Minute Sit up Test and the Speed Bounce Test. All pupils worked extremely hard during this full unit. Pushing themselves out of their comfort zones to try and get the best result they could. Specifically, in the harder tests; the Multi-Stage Fitness Test and the Cooper Run. Well Done to Lyla Duffy scoring the highest bleep test level with 12.3, Tilly Duffy second with 12.2 and Alice Carr third with 11.9. These are exceptional results and all pupils did brilliantly.

After fitness, pupils have completed one week of Table Tennis to practice ready for their intergroup competition. Intergroup involves each class being put into a team that they will stay in for every lesson. Each lesson they will compete in a different sport and be given different ways their team can gain points as well as from winning. We look at being a captain, teamwork, resilience, score keeping and helping others. We also focus on working with people we may not have worked with in PE before. Pupils have started with Table Tennis doubles and singles and bench ball. They will them move on to Badminton, football, netball, basketball and dodgeball. With the winning teams winning chocolate in time for Easter.

Well Done to every pupil putting in hard work in PE this half term. We look forward to being outside in the summer weather next term.

These may include body image, self-esteem, loneliness, bereavement, academic pressures, stress, anxiety, friendships, sexuality, life changes etc.

The registration process is quick, anonymous and safe, simply by registering at www.kooth.com using non-identifiable information.

Kooth delivers 1000's of online wellbeing sessions each year in Local Authorities across the UK. As 50% of referrals to CAMHS are unfortunately deemed inappropriate to their criteria, Kooth gives schools, professionals and families an alternative way of ensuring children and young people can access free support when they need it, in a way that they find comfortable to access, via any web-enabled device.
