As we come to the end of another busy and successful term at All Saints', I would like to take this opportunity to thank our students, staff and families for their continued commitment, support and dedication to our school community.

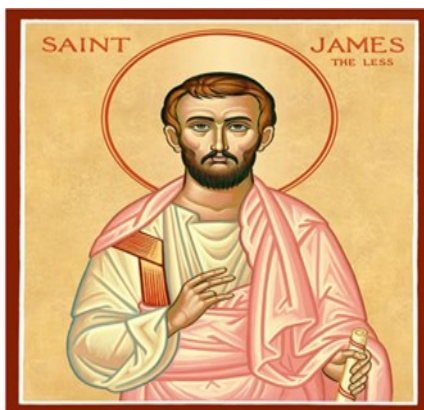
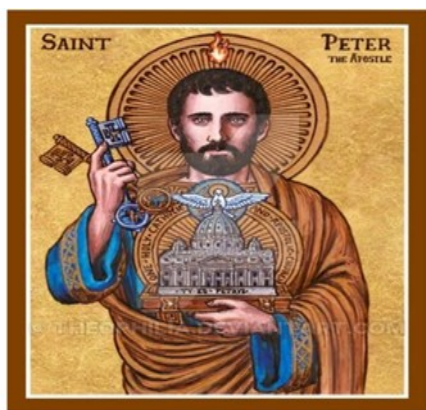

News from the RE Department

RE Trip to see the Relics of St Carlo Acutis in Burnley 29th January 2026

On the 29th January, 5 of our Year 7 Students had the unique opportunity to learn more about Carlo Acutis, our newest Catholic Saint, who was Canonized on September 7th 2025 in St Peter's Square, the Vatican by Pope Leo XIV. The students travelled to St Mary's Church, Burnley to see the holy relics and hear a talk by the visiting Priest from Assisi in Italy where he was Beatified.

St Carlo Acutis is recognized as a Saint for his devotion to the Eucharist, his strong Catholic faith and for his tireless ability to use the internet to document miracles. He is known as 'God's influencer' and the patron saint of the Internet. Students already study his journey to sainthood in their Year 7 RE Curriculum and so this was a wonderful opportunity for them to expand their studies and then share them with their classmates. The story of Carlo and how he was just a normal teenager who loved football and gaming and family life is easily understood by young people. He died tragically of Leukemia in 2006 aged only 15.

Students were all given a card which had a picture of Carlo and with which they touched the relics held aloft by the Priest. It was a beautiful and moving service with the church full of students from Catholic schools in the Diocese and beyond. Students were able to learn about intercessory prayers and that they could ask directly for a blessing from Carlo. The relics, a section of the pericardium (membrane surrounding the heart) were encased in a beautiful golden Monstrance for Veneration. We learned from the priest that Carlo's parents were blessed with twin girls following his passing and believe that this was a blessing directly from Carlo as they were born on the exact fourth anniversary of Carlo's death, providing profound comfort to the family.

In the words of Lee D'Arcy: 'We went up one by one to place our cards on the relic. The priest told us that our cards were themselves now a relic. Our School was allowed to have a picture taken with us holding the relic. Afterwards I felt blessed almost. It felt like God was patting me on the back.'

Abigail Bromley commented that: 'We could relate to Carlo because he was a normal child like us who loved computers and gaming. We were lucky enough to see a little bit of his heart and his favorite football shirt. Honestly, it was such a privilege!'

Saints' this will benefit our pupils in all subject areas as well as their GCSE exams. We also want to create a culture where pupils read for pleasure to help improve their mental well-being. Sparx can be accessed online through any device and pupils don't require log-ins and passwords. There are weekly leaderboards for pupils to strive to be on as well as regular competitions and prizes such as the recent Sparx Reader Easter Egg Competition. Please encourage your child to access Sparx Reader at home over Easter. Reading age data will be shared with parents in the coming weeks and we have intervention in place to support a range of pupils with reading at All Saints'.

In Level 2 – Organisers & Communicators, students worked in groups on challenges designed to develop their project management skills, coordinating roles and collaborating effectively.

In Level 3 – Builders & Problem Solvers, students worked with BBC micro:bit devices to explore and create different ciphers, applying their computational thinking to solve problems and experiment with encryption techniques.

It's fantastic to see so much collaboration, creativity and enthusiasm for computing as students work their way through the challenges.

We are proud of how students have engaged with these important topics, demonstrating maturity and a willingness to reflect on the world around them. We will continue to build on this work next term, ensuring our students are well-informed, resilient, and prepared for life beyond school.

Looking Ahead to Next Term

Next term, students will continue to build on their personal development through a range of targeted activities. Year 8 students will take part in mock interviews, for which they have already begun preparing, helping them to develop confidence and communication skills.

Year 7 will participate in a drop-down day focused on the world of work and the start of their careers journey. They will also explore important health and wellbeing topics, including vaping, addiction, and understanding a range of emotions and how to manage them effectively.

Year 10 will further develop their interview techniques and work readiness skills, alongside learning about healthy relationships, including recognising toxic behaviours and emotional abuse.

We will also be supporting the Fire Service's summer water safety and wildfire campaign, which will be promoted around school and explored during form time. This will help raise awareness of seasonal risks and ensure students understand how to stay safe in their local environment.

We look forward to continuing to support our students in becoming confident, informed, and resilient individuals.

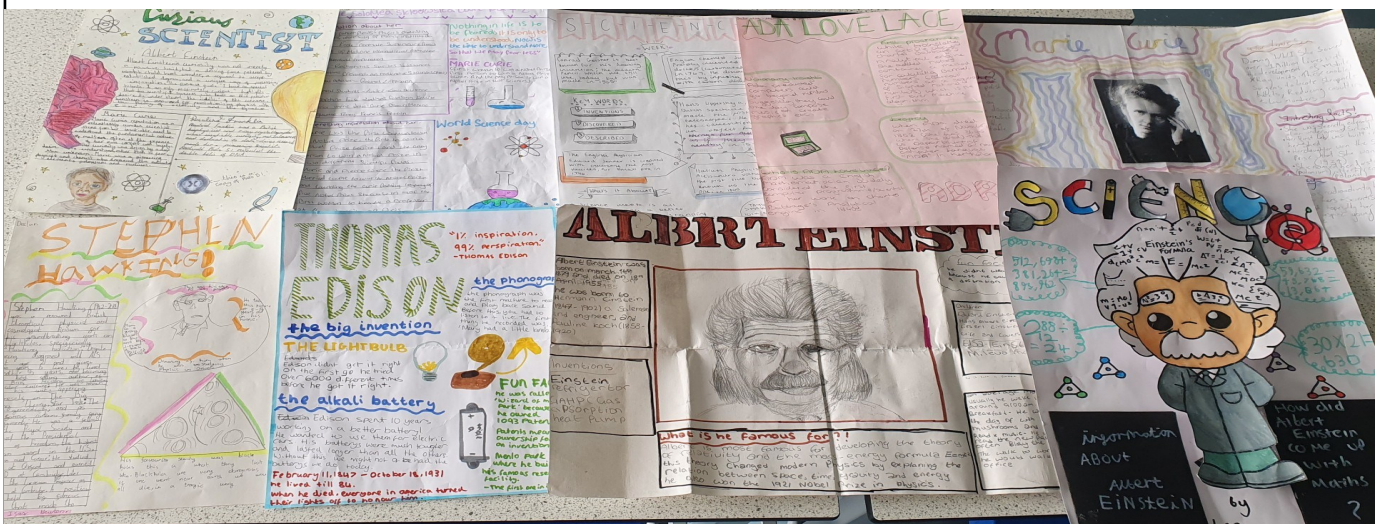
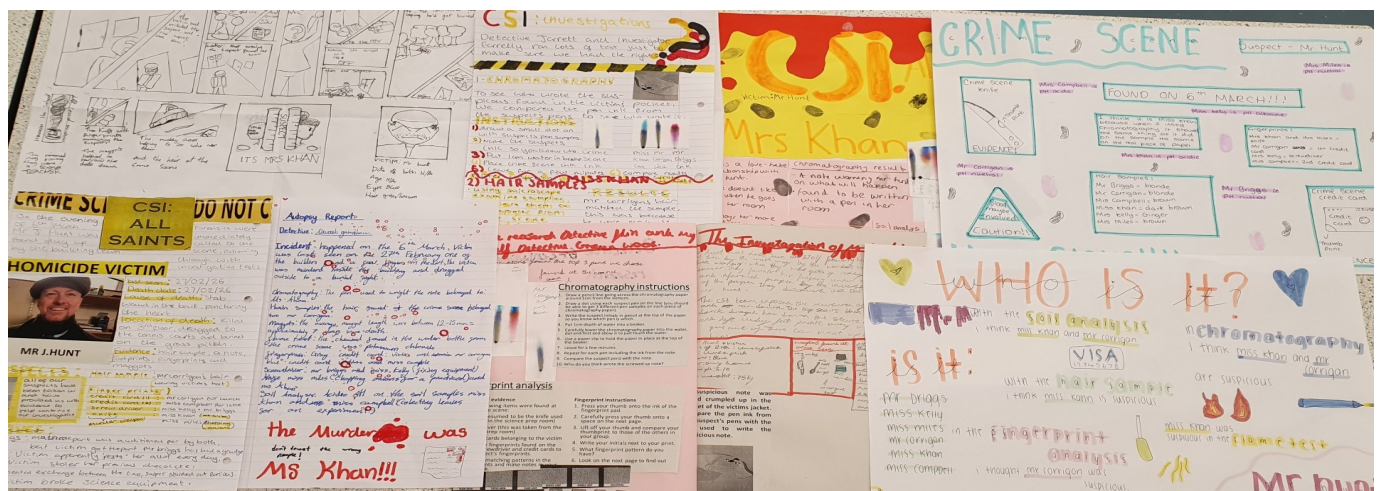

Be aware of any sudden changes in behaviour, friendships, or routines

If something doesn't feel right, trust your instincts and seek advice.

Online Safety

Young people often spend more time online during school holidays.

You can help by:

Talking openly about who they are speaking to online

Checking privacy settings on apps and games

Reminding them not to share personal information or images

Encouraging them to come to you if something worries them

if you are at the coast, ask for the Coastguard.

TELL
Tell them to float on their back and try to keep calm.

THROW
Throw them something that floats.
