Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to the last newsletter of 2023; the past 8 weeks have gone by in a flash!

Within this last half term, we have seen the school come together as a community to mark Remembrance Day; the students were a real credit and I would like to once again pay special thanks to the students who contributed and participated in the service.

The school show was a fantastic success. The time, effort and dedication put in by staff and students was well worth it and with packed audiences on both nights sharing the joy and laughter of not only our students but some notable staff members who may have possibly missed their true calling to be on the stage!

Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been another busy term in the RE Department! As we journey through Advent, we are preparing the way to celebrate the birth of Jesus and welcome him into our lives at Christmas. This year, Pope Francis has a theme of 'vigilance' as part of his Christmas message. The Pope encourages us to look out for others this year. He invites us, this Advent, to share with anyone in need – giving our time, listening, and helping.

On 1st November we celebrated our school's Feast Day with whole school Masses and liturgies. Many thanks to Fr Chris for celebrating these. Later that afternoon we celebrated the life of Mrs Clare Atherton, former Head of RE. This was an extremely moving mass and a joyful remembrance of a well-loved, well-respected, and much-missed member of our school family. Thank you to all who were able to attend: family, friends, former pupils, staff and representatives from our Primary schools – particularly St James the Less – where she was Chair of Governors; former staff members from All Saints' and particularly to Fr Paul Cannon (Clare's cousin who led the Mass); Canon David Lupton; Canon Tony McBride and Fr Joe Gee (former teacher at All Saints'). We had a memorial candle made that was lit, and that will stay in the school.



In November we had our Rossendale Penny Boxes collected – this year, we were the Secondary school who collected the most money, knocking Haslingden High off the top spot! The Challenge has been running for over 17 years and has raised in the region of £70,000 for the Hospice, all of which goes towards supporting the Valley's community who are living with a life limiting condition. Rossendale Hospice aims to positively influence a future in which everyone within the Rossendale community facing life limiting illness receives the best possible care and support.

We continue to strive to demonstrate Catholic Social Teaching and 'love of neighbour' with our RAFT Christmas Hamper appeal. Forms were given the task of creating a food hamper for RAFT, our local foodbank. Many thanks for all the donations that were gratefully received. They will make a real difference. Volunteers who arrived to collect the hampers were overwhelmed by the amount of food that was collected. Thank you!





In November we held a remembrance service to remember all those who have lost their lives and those who have been affected by war. KS3 - A group of 30 Year 7 pupils have taken part in an exciting research project this half term funded by Sport England and delivered through Edge Hill University. The study is focused on physical activity rates amongst young people. The pupils completed fitness tests including 'The Dragon Challenge' as well as memory and cognitive assessments and they also completed questionnaires and surveys on their physical and mental well-being. The pupils had to wear an activity watch for a 7-day period; this tracked levels of physical activity as well as sleep patterns.



The pupils engaged really well and received glowing praise from the Edge Hill research team.

The Y7 basketball team played their first fixtures for school in friendly matches against Haslingden High School. The A Team won their fixture 12-2, whilst the B team narrowly lost 5-2. The squad will compete in the Lancashire Cup group stage in January. The Year 7 Boys Indoor Athletics team gave a fantastic performance in the Rossendale Schools Competition amassing an impressive 160 points and only finished 2nd to BRGS by 4 points. Well done boys!

A group of Year 7 pupils participated in a Y6/7 Indoor Athletics Competition hosted at All Saints' where 11 schools in total participated. The team performed a range of sporting activities and thoroughly enjoyed the event. A group of 17 Year 9 pupils were Sports Leaders for the event and were superb ambassadors for All Saints' - a big well done to you all.

The Year 8 indoor athletics team have their event in the final week of term at TVLA.

The U14s boys' basketball team have made a positive start in their Lancashire Cup campaign. The team narrowly lost 32-22 to Alder Grange in an entertaining game before an amazing team performance saw them comprehensively beat Haslingden: 64-6! The lads have their final group game against BRGS in the final week of term but are already guaranteed a last 16 place in the new year.

In PE this half term the boys have developed their skills, knowledge and understanding in basketball, table tennis and dodgeball. Attitude, behaviour and effort levels have been excellent - keep up the great work lads!

KS4 - The U16s basketball team have also booked their place in the last 16 after qualifying from a tough group. The lads had two very entertaining and hard-fought games against Haslingden A and Parklands before losing 53-28 and 51-33 respectively. The team had a well-deserved victory against Haslingden B, running out 58-15 winners.

In Sport Studies, the Y10s have completed their logbooks and have been working hard planning sport sessions that they will deliver and be assessed in later in the year. The Y11 group are now finishing their module on Sports' Leadership and will be focusing on Sport and the Media after Christmas.


Accelerated Reader Rewards.
