
INTRODUCING OUR NEW EXECUTIVE HEADTEACHER

I have already met with school governors, Mr McNally, SLT and many of the staff, pupils and parents, both formally and informally. I am so grateful that I have been made to feel so welcome by all concerned.

Pupil behaviour has improved but we still have a long way to go. It is so important that all pupils understand how important it is to behave well in lessons and around school. Good behaviour creates an environment where all pupils feel safe in school. Teachers can then do their job effectively and all pupils can enjoy learning in lessons!

We have made two minor changes to the school behaviour policy. We have introduced a 10 second rule between each stage and taken a zero policy on mobile phones! For further details please see our updated policy on the school website.

We have also taken a zero-tolerance policy on pupils who persistently demonstrate poor behaviour in school by escalating suspensions. We take no pleasure in suspending pupils from school but sometimes you have got to say enough is enough and think about the negative impact persistently poor behaviour has day in and day out on all the other pupils in lessons and the staff! Like all schools, All Saints' has limited resources and strategies available to support pupils who demonstrate persistent poor attendance and behaviour. These resources and strategies are now included in a personal support plan (PSP) that will be shared with parents, pupils and staff. The PSP will be tracked and monitored regularly and updated, if necessary, by the school Progress Leaders.

After half term we hope to be able to improve the school environment in a sensible and cost-effective way with photographs of current pupils in school. We are also going to buy noticeboards that can be put up on the corridors to recognise and celebrate the many achievements of pupils., purchases that can be used for years to come.

Many thanks for your support and I look forward to working with the school to ensure that all your children get the best possible school experience.

Well Done to all involved and Good Luck in your future netball tournaments.




FXAMS
